### May Birthdays: Bob Hope

Bob Hope was a British-born American entertainer and comic actor known for his jokes and one-liners, as well as his success in the entertainment industry and his decades of overseas tours to entertain American troops. Hope received numerous awards and honors for his work as an entertainer and humanitarian.

Hope was born in Eltham, UK, on May 29, 1903. Bob Hope's family emigrated to Cleveland, Ohio, in 1908 where he grew up entertaining the locals with dance and comedy routines. His father, William, was a stonemason and his mother, Avis, was an opera singer. He won amateur talent contests and also briefly took up boxing.

His film career started in New York with Educational Pictures and Vitaphone, but it was with Paramount that Bob Hope became a household name. He starred in the famous "Road" movies as a double act with Bing Crosby, and his leading ladies in other movies included Jane Russell and Lucille Ball. Dorothy Lamour also appeared in the "Road" movies with Hope and Crosby. Despite hosting the Academy Awards many times, Hope was never nominated and once quipped whilst presenting Humphrey Bogart with his Oscar for *The African Queen*, "Give me that. You've got one."

Hope's broadcast career lasted 64 years during which time he appeared on both radio and television, mainly for NBC. He presented *The Bob Hope Show* from 1950 until 1955, and also presented many TV specials and it's rumored ad-libbed his way through his appearance on the popular *I Love Lucy* program. He also made a guest appearance in 1992 on *The Simpsons* playing himself.

Bob Hope first appeared on Broadway in the 1920s with a number of walk-on parts which led to larger roles during the 1930s for which he received good reviews. He appeared in the Ziegfeld Follies as well as *Red, Hot and Blue* with Jimmy Durante and Ethel Merman.

Hope had a long relationship with the United Services Organizations (USO), starting during the Second World War and continuing until the Persian Gulf War in 1991. Congress named him an 'Honorary Veteran' in tribute to his tireless work for the USO. He performed 60 tours and when overseas always performed in army fatigues as a sign of support for the troops.

His long career with the USO led to the phrase, "Where there's death, there's Hope." He died on July 27, 2003.

## THE PROPER WAY TO WEAR A FACE MASK

- Wash your hands prior to handling your mask.
- Make sure the mask is right side up. The metal nose piece should be over your nose or the pleats should be facing downward. Make sure the correct/clean side of the mask is against your face.
- Pull the straps around each ear or over your head. The top strap should be around the back, near the crown of your head and above your ears. The bottom strap should be around the back of your neck, near your hairline and under your ears.
- If your mask has a metal nosepiece, bend the nose piece over the bridge of your nose to ensure it is air tight against your face.
- Make sure the bottom of the mask covers the underside of your chin.
- Make sure the sides of the masks, on your cheeks, are not open or a gap is exposed where air can enter.
- Your mask should be covering your nose and mouth at all times to ensure proper usage.
  - When wearing and removing your mask, be sure you are not touching the exposed/dirty side of the mask. Also be sure to not drag the exposed/dirty side of the face mask over your face.
  - If possible, wash your mask in hot water after each use.
  - Always wash your hands after removing your mask.

### MY JOURNEY

From an Iowa Farm to a Cathedral of Dreams

I think that almost everyone has seen the TV show "Hour of Power." This is the autobiography of the pastor who was responsible for it. He starts by being "born in 1926 at the dead end of a road that had no name or number." The closest town to the farm was Newkirk which is not shown on my Iowa map. However, Alton, the next closest is and today has a population of 1200. That's the same as the town one and a half miles from Dad's farm and where my school was located!

The first part tells of his struggles through school while wanting to be 'a preacher'. Then in 1947, he enters seminary. In June, 1950, he was married to Arvella and confirmed in the Reformed Church of America. Robert's first church was at Dolton, IL, deep suburban Chicago which had a divided congregation. He kept them together for five years until he was sent to Orange, CA, to start a church where none existed.

On the way out, he listed ten places he could rent for his church. All were taken or otherwise not available except for number 10, a drive-in theater. Thus he started preaching from the roof of the concession stand. He was well-received and maintained a place for people in cars to attend worship services even when his Crystal Cathedral was opened! He details some of the problems he had raising money to build and maintain private worship facilities. Also the production of the Hour of Power.

My wife and I visited and toured the Crystal Cathedral while in CA. I commented to our guide how difficult it would be to have a worship service fit the broadcast time. He told me it was easy! They tape the service and then have a week to edit the tape for broadcast next Sunday!

He also pointed out it has no air conditioning! Just a number of thermostatic windows near the top that open when it gets too warm up there! Also two 20-foot-wide doors that can be opened on the rare occasion when the windows are not enough.

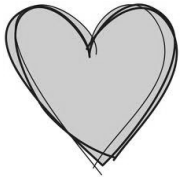

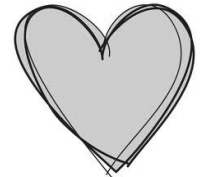

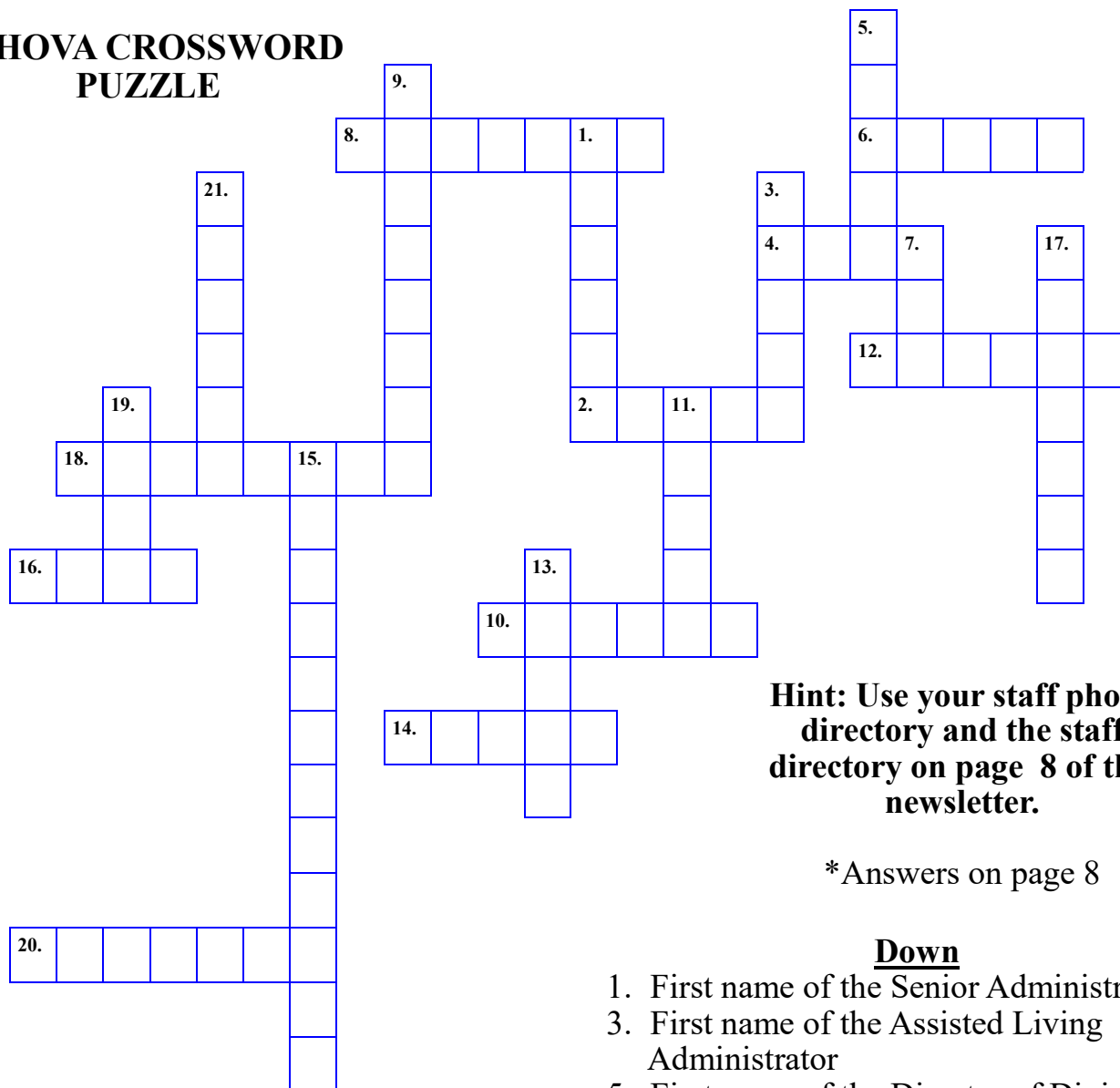
